As we begin a new calendar year of worship and service, please consider offering your time and talents at any of the many opportunities to help with local ministries and church programming.

The church nursery needs staffing every Sunday of the year, at both the Sunday school hour and during Sunday worship. You'll need to pass a background check to work in the nursery, and to work with children and youth programming. Check with Financial Coordinator Dana Adams to schedule a free-to-you check-up.

The Alamance Presbyterian Church Food Pantry desires volunteer help on Wednesdays, to pack shelf-stable groceries into 30 grocery carts; on Saturdays — to apportion perishable goods into those same carts, and to roll the carts out to the clients who drive here to collect their groceries. The Food Pantry also uses volunteer aid on one Tuesday each month, to drive to Second Harvest Food Bank and pick up food. Volunteers pick up donated food from the Woody Mill Food Lion several times a month.

Missions Update: Submitted by Jesse & Erin, Samuel, and Amos Atkinson: Wycliffe Translators, Oaxaca (wah-HAH-kah), Mexico Serving the Zapotec people of San Dionisio

At the beginning of November, Mexico celebrated the Day of the Dead, a multi-day celebration (despite the name sounding like just *one* day!) where families gather to remember the dead. Despite the wonderful family time, beautiful marigolds used to decorate, and delicious food that accompany this holiday, it's a very dark spiritual time in the area where we live, with ancestor worship and offerings made to the dead, and many other animistic beliefs.

Spiritual warfare sometimes feels heavier during these days, so we were thankful when the small church in San Dionisio chose to spend one of the days of these festivities on a retreat at a nearby river where five young people were baptized! We also took advantage of this "field day" with the congregation to have them fill out a survey about our tentative alphabet for their variety of Zapotec. It was a long but good day filled with fellowship and worship!


